Record of Proceedings March 23, 1995

Call to Order The meeting was called to order by the President at 8:00 p.m.

Roll Call of Trustees Present: Bonita Hutcheson, Richard Lynch, Earl McCoy, Cliff Mueller, and Charles West

Approval of Minutes Charles West moved, and Earl McCoy seconded, a motion that the minutes of the February 23 meeting be approved as mailed. The motion carried.

Old Business

Ordinance for Historic Preservation: At the last meeting there was discussion, as reported in the minutes, of the proposals to be included in an ordinance to be recommended to City Council. President Hutcheson will put these ideas together into a form ready to present to attorneys who will draft an ordinance for consideration by the Council. The material will be discussed at the April meeting before it goes to the attorneys.

President Hutcheson will prepare a letter to these people requesting a written history and outlining some types of items to include.

New Business

The President commented on the recent death of Robert Sitler, who had been aleader and a public official in Sheridan for many years and was also active in the organization of the present Sheridan Historical Society. The President will send a card from the Historical Society to Mr. Sitler's family.

Mr. Svigel and the Log Cabins: Cliff Mueller will work with Mr. Svigel to talk about what can be done to find a place to move the log cabins, before the highway widening requires the building's demolition. Before any action can be taken, the Board will have to look at costs and budgets for rental or taxes on a possible location, insurance, fencing, utilities and other expenses.
